A look at how memory reconstructs the past, the real functions of nostalgia, remembering an imperfect family with affection, and why a particular childhood feels universal.

It's not what's under the tree that matters...

1 THE STORY IS TOLD THROUGH MEMORY



- How does adult Ralphie's narration shape the way we experience his childhood?
- What details feel emphasized, heightened, or softened because of memory?
- How might your own memories of childhood be similar?

2 NOSTALGIA SERVES REAL PURPOSES



- What feelings does the film's nostalgia bring up for you?
- How does nostalgia help us feel connected, comforted, or grounded?
- Can nostalgia be both helpful and limiting?

3 AN IMPERFECT FAMILY, REMEMBERED WITH LOVE



- The Parkers argue, struggle, and make mistakes—just like real families.
- How does the film show love within imperfection?
- What makes a family feel like "home" to you?

4 THE POWER OF A SINGLE CHRISTMAS WISH



- Why is Ralphie's wish for the BB gun so important?
- How does having a goal give childhood purpose and excitement?
- What did you long for as a child? What did it teach you about yourself?

REFLECT TOGETHER



What are some favorite memories that still bring you warmth?



What family traditions or stories help connect you across generations?



How can we focus on what truly matters this holiday season?

5 THE BEAUTY IS IN THE SMALL MOMENTS



- Think of a small moment in the film that made you smile.
- Why do small, everyday moments often become the ones we remember most?
- What small moments from your own life stand out?

6 HUMOR HELPS US HOLD THE HARD STUFF



- The film is funny, even when things are frustrating.
- How does humor help Ralphie (and his family) get through challenges?
- How does humor help you cope with stress or disappointment?

7 MEMORY HIGHLIGHTS WHAT MATTERS MOST



Home is where our stories live.

- Memory edits what it keeps—and what it lets go.
- What themes or values shine through in Ralphie's memories (kindness? family? resilience?)
- What do you want your future self to remember most?

8 WHY THIS STORY FEELS UNIVERSAL



- Even though it's set in the 1940s, it feels timeless.
- What parts of the story feel true for kids and families today?
- Why do you think we return to this story every year?
