BEFORE WATCHING

Set the stage and open minds.

- What messages do young people receive about success, obedience, and making adults proud?
- When does structure help a child grow, and when can it begin to shrink them?

WHILE WATCHING

Notice the pressures shaping each student.

- How do authority, fear, and the desire to belong affect the students' choices?
- When does encouragement become liberation, and when might it become pressure of a different kind?
- What moments show a student discovering a voice that had been hidden?

AFTER WATCHING

Reflect on identity, loss, and courage.

- What does the story suggest about the emotional cost of conformity?
- Why can becoming yourself create conflict in families or systems built around obedience?
- What does healthy guidance look like compared with control?
