Belonging and the Courage of Unlikely Talent

FAMILY DISCUSSION GUIDE

Use this guide to connect as a family, talk about belonging, and celebrate talent that comes from unexpected places.



1. BEFORE WATCHING

Set the stage and open hearts and minds.

- ♥ Have you ever felt like you did not belong somewhere, even though you were good at something?
- ♥ What does it mean to say "a great cook can come from anywhere"?



2. WHILE WATCHING

Pay attention to talent, doubt, and turning points.

- ♥ What does Remy love to do, and why do others think it is strange for someone like him?
- ♥ Who gets the credit for the cooking, and who is really doing the work?
- ♥ How does the critic change when he tastes the simple dish?



3. AFTER WATCHING

Reflect together and make meaning.

- ♥ Why does it take courage for Remy to keep cooking when no one expects a rat to be a chef?
- ♥ How does Remy's father show love even though he does not fully understand his son?
- ♥ Why does the new, smaller restaurant feel more honest than the famous one?



4. FAMILY REFLECTION

Go deeper with empathy, honesty, and connection.

- ♥ Where do you have a real talent that surprises people?
- ♥ Who is someone in your life who supports you even when they do not fully understand your dreams?
- ♥ Try this: Name one thing you love doing that nobody told you to do, and share why it matters to you.
